Title of decision	PR1181 Hinton Way (Great Shelford) removal of parking bay and installation of double yellow lines.

Details of decision taken	After a review of the details of the proposed scheme and taking into account the written representation received, the Service Director of the Greater Cambridge Partnership, in conjunction with Councillor Peter Fane and Councillor Laurence Damary-Homan, decided that the proposals should be implemented as published. The objectors and others who submitted written representations will be informed of the outcome accordingly.
Reasons for taking decision	Objections were raised to the removal of parking and installation of double yellow lines on Hinton Way, citing the demand for parking outside the local shop and post office. The removal of the parking bay will allow priority narrowing to be put in place on Hinton Way, which requires the bus stop serving the Tiger 3 bus service, to be relocated. Parking provision will remain available directly outside of the local shop and consists of five parking bays. A large access is also available to accommodate HGVs. Delivery vehicles will be able to stop for short periods to allow loading and unloading on double yellow lines.
