Achieve net carbon zero and improve air quality


Provide better public transport, walking & cycling





# Planned infrastructure investment

- Four new public transport corridors (mid 2020s)
- Linked through centre to form CAM metro (2030 earliest)
- Walking, cycling and equestrian greenways
- Cambridge South Station



#### But what else do we need to do?

- Making buses faster, and more reliable
- Making public transport cheap, or free
- Invest more in cycling and walking
- Rural transport
- Cleaner vehicles
- More Park & Ride and Park & Cycle






